
IICRD

The **BC Coordinator position** is a key position in the initiative offering continuity and coordination for the BC partners. They will be working with the IICRD team (Ontario Coordinator and support, Project Manager and Director, Trainers, Developmental Evaluator and Advisory) to coordinate, pilot and continue to evolve the YouLEAD initiative.

In collaboration with the YouLEAD team, you will:

- Recruit and support youth leaders/trainers to participate in YouLEAD certificate courses, including developing marketing material, participating in outreach activities and meetings.
- Identify school district, university and college programs that have shared interests/mandate with YouLEAD, including on-line research and organizing meetings with the Project Manager
- Support the logistics and delivery of training certificate courses, e.g. youth travel, orientation materials, evaluations
- Participate in bi-weekly team meetings and attend training sessions, courses and conferences as needed
- Contribute to learning platforms and social media
- Provide support to Project Manager and other team members to prepare funder reports, organize meetings, prepare website stories, etc.

You have:

- Knowledge of Aboriginal communities and familiarity with an Indigenous world view
- Knowledge of youth engagement principles and practices
- Ability to work well in a team and with partners
- Ability to use social media and are computer savvy, graphic design is an asset
- Ability and willingness to learn and innovate new solutions
- Ability to work within a fluid, evolving environment
- Ability to work independently, reliably and in an organized fashion
- Connections with Aboriginal communities and/or service organizations (FN, Metis or Inuit heritage an asset)
