



CPP Thailand Mission Report – Brief Version (2009 Synthesis)

March 22, 2010

Introduction

2009 was a fruitful year for CPP in South East Asia and the activities undertaken have laid a strong foundation for 2010. 2010 also brings a series of new dimensions to the project: including the departure of the Circle of Rights Advisor from the field, the hiring of a new South East Asia Program Manager, and the transitioning of project activities from participatory action research to action plan implementation and replication. Accordingly, this mission was opportune to help document and reflect on the CPP process in Thailand in accordance with CPP's Intermediate Outcomes, and finalize plans to complete outstanding deliverables. It was also an opportunity to meet with the newly hired South East Asia Program Manager for IICRD, and strategize about the reconfiguration of CPP operationalization and implementation for the remainder of the project.

CPP Objectives

- Law enforcement, governments and supporting public bodies are better able to address ICT enabled child sexual exploitation
- Female and male children and their communities have access to responsive legal and other protections that prevent and address ICT enabled child sexual exploitation
- A coordinated systems approach is used by multiple sector partners to prevent and address ICT enabled child sexual exploitation from a child rights perspective

Mission Objectives:

Specific objectives include:

- a. Visit with implementation partners in the region to collect data for the monitoring and evaluation process
- b. Facilitate meetings between IICRD and consultants working in the region
- c. Assist in the transition process of the new IICRD Project Manager embedded in Southeast Asia
- d. Draft the Circle of Rights Summary Report in conjunction with representatives from Chulalongkorn University
- e. Assist in the development of a narrative report outlining outcomes from the activities in Thailand for 2009 in collaboration with Chulalongkorn University

- f. Assist in drafting the Child Protection Systems Mapping document with CPP Thailand Special Advisor with CPP staff support

Positive Developments

- Strategizing and completion of a Child Protection System Mapping Document
- Focal areas for 2010 described as: round tables, curriculum, and community policing initiatives.
- Introduced the new SE Asia CPP Project Manager, Jamnan Panpatama fully to CPP and IICRD.
- The children of Klongtoey held an ICT exhibition to educate over 250 of their friends and families about the lessons learned with regards to ICT and child protection through their involvement with CPP.
- Solidified relationship with Certiport and discussed logistics around the development of the IC4 curriculum.
