Klung Toey, Bangkok, Thailand

Klung Toey, a district in central Bangkok, consists of 3 sub-districts and has a population of over 160,000 people.

The Klung Toey slum is an important CPP site due to the high levels of child vulnerability that is present, including sexual exploitation.

CPP Activities to Date



Children participating in Triple A activities
in Klung Toey

- Working with a cohort of approximately 50 children aged 12-16
- Focus identified as vulnerable children and their families living in the Klong Toey slum
- 3 Triple “A” trainings with engagement tools completed
- Triple “A” Assessment and Action activities completed

Future CPP Events in Klung Toey

- It is anticipated that the Mercy Centre in Klung Toey will function as the pilot site for a newly developed Certiport curriculum (IC4) in upcoming months
- Ongoing work with the Circle of Rights to continue capturing the lived realities of children to assist with the development of strategies on how to ensure ICT safety
